To Greg Lumbert, a Constable of the Town of Farmingdale, in the County of Kennebec State of Maine,

GREETINGS,

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Farmingdale, in said county and state, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the **Farmingdale Town Office** in said town on **TUESDAY, the 11th day of June. A.D. 2024, at 8:00 a.m., then and there to act on Article 1 and by secret ballot on Article 2, as set out below, the polling hours therefore to be from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.**

And, to notify and warn said Inhabitants to meet at the **HALL-DALE HIGH SCHOOL THEATRE** in said town on **THURSDAY, the 13<sup>th</sup> day of JUNE, 2024, A.D., at 6:00 p.m.,** then and there to act on **Articles 3 through 68** as set out below,

To wit:

**Article 1.** To elect a moderator to preside at said meeting and to vote by written ballot.

**Article 2.** To elect by secret ballot one (1) Selectperson, for a three (3) year term.

**GENERAL GOVERNMENT**

**Article 3.** To see if the Town will vote to amend the Code of Ordinances, Chapter 4, Article 1 (Permit Required) Section 4-101.

**Article 6.** To see if the Town, pursuant to 23 M.R.S. Section 3025, will vote to accept the dedication made by MMT Acquisitions LLC of an easement interest in a strip of land known as Violet Drive and described on survey prepared by E.S. Coffin Engineering, and to accept and establish a town way and public easement on said strip of land.

**Article 7.** To see what action the Town will take in authorizing the Select Board to transfer monies between expenditure accounts.

**Article 8.** To see if the Town will set the dates of October 10, 2024 and April 08, 2025 when taxes are due and payable and to see if the Town will fix the interest rate on unpaid taxes at 8.5% (eight.five percent) per annum (36 MRSA §505 (4) and to set the dates that interest starts on unpaid taxes commencing on the first half October 11, 2024 and on the second half on April 9, 2025.

**Article 9.** To see if the Town will vote, pursuant to 36 M.R.S.A. Section 506-A, to set an interest rate of 4.5% to be paid on overpaid abated taxes.

For sales to someone other than the former owner, excess sale proceeds, as defined in 36 M.R.S. § 943-C, shall be returned to the former owner.

**Article 27.** To see if the Town will vote to (1) approve the purchase of a new fire truck for the Town of Farmingdale including transaction costs and other expenses reasonably related hereto; (2) **appropriate** a sum up to \$300,000 to fund the project; (3) **authorize** the Town Treasurer and the Chair of the Selectboard to issue general obligation securities of the Town in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$300,000.00 to fund the appropriation; (4) **delegate** to the Treasurer and the Chair of the Selectboard the authority and discretion to fix the dates, maturities, interest rates, denomination, calls for redemption (with or without premium), form and other details of securities, including authority to execute and deliver the securities on behalf of the Town. Payments will be approximately \$30,000.00 per year.
